

**ISO TC 207 WG5 Part 2 Toronto Meeting  
April 2004  
ECOLOGIA Report on Process and Participation**

The Toronto meeting was sparsely attended, with only 7 highly developed countries represented. Three liaison groups sent participants. The small size of the group, along with improved facilitation, and prior discussion of a key agenda item over email, resulted in a smoother, more productive meeting than the very contentious previous meeting in London. However, the small size of the group also prevented the making of conclusive decisions on a number of matters, and it seems likely that many matters will need to be revisited with a larger group.
